ATHLETIC HANDBOOK FOR PARTICIPATION IN ATHLETICS AT QUEEN'S GRANT HIGH SCHOOL

PARTICIPATION FEE

The fee to participate in any athletic program at Queen's Grant High School is \$200.00. This fee is per athlete, per sport played, and is not a one-time only fee. This fee may be in addition to another fee that may be requested if additional funds are needed for a specific sport. This fee will help cover officials; facilities, game day preparations, equipment etc. Please make your check payable to Queen's Grant High School. (NO CASH) No uniforms will be issued to an athlete until the fee is paid in full.

Queen's Grant High School does have a \$25.00 returned check fee. After a returned check, fees will only be accepted in the form of a money order. (NO CASH)

ACADEMIC PROBATION

In the case that a student athlete falls below a 2.5 GPA on a progress report, issued at the ½ way point of the nine week quarter, the student athlete will be placed on academic probation. The student athlete will remain on academic probation for a period of two weeks (regardless of positive changes in grades). After two weeks, all athletes' grades will be evaluated. Those on academic probation will have a chance to return to full participation as long as the 2.5 GPA requirements are met. If the requirements are not met, the student athlete will be placed on academic suspension until the nine week quarter grades (report cards), regardless of positive changes in grades. Athletes not on academic probation may be placed on probation at this point if the 2.5 GPA requirements are not met. Academic probation consists of the student athlete attending at least one hour of tutoring a week. Tutoring will be tracked by the athlete and teacher completing an academic form, given to the coach at the end of each week.

ACADEMIC SUSPENSION

In the case that a student athlete falls below a 2.5 GPA at the nine week quarter mark (report cards), the student athlete will be placed on academic suspension. The student athlete will remain on academic suspension for a period of two weeks (regardless of positive changes in grades), at which point the student athlete will have a chance to return to full participation as long as the GPA requirements are met. If the requirements are not met, the student athlete will remain on academic suspension until the next progress report (regardless of positive changes in grades). If a student athlete is cleared from academic suspension, the student athlete will go back to the probation period if GPA requirements are not met at the next check. Academic suspension consists of removal from all participation in games, matches, and events. The student athlete cannot serve in any capacity at games. The student athlete may still attend practice at the discretion of the parent/legal guardian.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES FOR H.S. ATHLETICS AT QUEEN'S GRANT HIGH SCHOOL

1. All students must be enrolled in Queen's Grant High School to participate.
2. All athletes must turn in a current physical (within one year of actual physical date) to the athletic director before ANY participation in sports. (This includes tryouts).
3. Students may not participate if he/she becomes 19 years of age on or before October 16 of the participation year.
4. No student may be eligible to participate at the high school level for a period lasting longer than 8 consecutive semesters, beginning with the student's first entry into the 9th grade.
5. If a student athlete is suspended from school (OSS), he/she will be suspended from all participation in athletics until the last day of suspension is served. (This includes games and practices.)
6. If at ANY time a student athlete is found using, holding, purchasing, or selling tobacco, alcohol, illegal substances, or weapons on school campus, he/she will immediately be removed from the team. Coaches may also mandate a conduct policy for teams; in addition to the school policy.
7. A student athlete must be in attendance an entire school day to participate in practices or games/events that same day. (Unless approved by the Principal and/or Athletic Director.)
8. Students who are currently a member of a team, and who transfer from a school within or from outside the conference during a sport season must sit out the remainder of that season. (Mid year transfers, lose the right to participate in whatever season is already in play. This includes conference and non conference games).

UNIFORM POLICY

Queen's Grant High School will provide the necessary attire for athletes to compete. All issued uniform pieces are required to be returned to the coach or Athletic Director at the end of the season. Uniforms are expected to be in a reasonable condition when returned. Normal wear and tear, grass stains, etc. is expected. Athletic Director and Principal's discretion will be used on determining acceptable conditions of returned uniforms. If pieces or the full uniform are not returned, a fee will be issued and will be required to be paid before further participation in sports.

GAME DAY UNIFORM DRESS

Game day dress attire is required to be worn to school on the day of any game/match (home or away).

LADIES: School uniform pants (any color pants—plaid skirt is not permitted), and a plain white button up dress shirt. (Dress shirt does NOT have to be a school uniform top) (High heeled shoes are not permitted for game day dress)

GENTLEMEN: School uniform pants (any color pants), a plain white button up dress shirt, and a tie. (Dress shirt and tie do NOT have to be school uniform attire)

PRACTICE ATTIRE REQUIREMENTS/RESTRICTIONS

LADIES: No tank tops. If shorts are more than 3" above the knee, biker shorts must be worn underneath.

GENTLEMAN: Shirts must be worn at all times.

By signing this contract, I understand that I must follow the standards set by Queen's Grant High School's athletes, coaches, teachers, and parents. In addition, I also understand that any violation of these policies will jeopardize my ability to be a part of any athletic team at Queen's Grant High School. I understand that the Athletic Director and/or Administration reserve the right to alter any policies in this handbook due to specific/special circumstances.

TRANSPORTATION FORM

Queen's Grant High School does not provide any form of transportation through the school to and from sporting events.

Coaches are NOT permitted to provide transportation to and from sporting events, and or practices.

The most ideal situation would be to have transportation provided by the athlete's parent(s) or legal guardian.

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If I am unable to provide transportation, I give permission for my child to be transported to and from a sporting event by someone other than myself. Knowing that the adult driver/chaperone will take the utmost care of my child's safety, I understand that accidents do occur and that in such situations immediate steps must be taken to secure my child's health. I hereby authorize the Staff of Queen's Grant High School to seek medical attention for my child should an emergency arise, provided that I will be contacted as soon as possible.

Failure to reach me shall not prevent an application of immediate, necessary medical or dental treatment, not excluding injection, anesthesia or surgery, at my expense. In case of an accident, I will not hold the driver of the vehicle or anyone associated with Queens Grant High School liable.
